INTRODUCTION

FATHER MULLER HOMOEOPATHIC MEDICAL COLLEGE & HOSPITAL, unit of Father Muller Charitable Institutions, a Registered Society sponsored by the Catholic Diocese of Mangalore; is a Religious Minority Educational Institution established primarily for the benefit of the members of the Christian Community. It is open, like all other Educational Institutions under Catholic auspices, to all persons irrespective of religion, caste or community and is affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka, Bangalore, recognized by Central Council of Homoeopathy, New Delhi and Department of Ayush, Govt. of India.

In the year 1980, Father Muller Charitable Institution celebrated its centenary and to commemorate this event a decision was taken to start a Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital. After a thorough study the College was actually started in the year 1985 to conduct BHMS course. Now the College has been recognized for M.D. (Hom) course by C.C.H. & R.G.U.H.S.

Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical College & Hospital has completed 28 years of its successful and meaningful existence in the field of Homoeopathic Education and Practice. The students who pass out from this college have been much sought after professionals both in the practice and by Homoeopathic Institutions in the country and abroad. The tradition of Patient care, Knowledge care and Learners care is continuing with accentuated zeal since the inception of this College which helps the students to evolve into competent and committed Homoeopathic academicians and clinicians.

The College is situated at Deralakatte in a new campus of 36 acres wherein the Homoeo Manufactory, Gents and Ladies hostel and a Herbal Garden are situated. The Homoeo College as well as Homoeopathic Hospital with all facilities is built as per the requirement prescribed by the Apex Body. It has full fledged 12 U.G. departments and 7 P.G. departments.

Father Muller Charitable Institutions had a humble beginning under a Banyan tree where Fr Augustus Muller S.J. started dispensing Homoeopathic Medicines free of charge to the ailing poor. His spiritual ideals and motivation reflecting Christian Love continue to guide the destinies of the Institutions which have been steadily expanding their services, ever remaining in the vanguard of medical progress. F.M.C.I. have been blessed with a succession of selfless, dedicated personnel, Medical and Nursing staff, Para-medical workers and others with a CARE for all, irrespective of religion, caste or community.

Father Muller Charitable Institution has been rendering comprehensive medical care with its motto 'Heal and Comfort'. The entire Hospital Complex has now a total of 1250 beds devoted to the various specialities with well-developed modern facilities for treatment. A Leprosy Centre, a Rehabilitation Centre, a School of Nursing, a College of Nursing, B.Sc. in Physiotherapy, B.Sc. in Radiography, B.Sc. in Medical Laboratory Technology, Hospital Aids training, M.Sc. in Hospital Management, Undergraduate (MBBS) and Post Graduation (MD/MS) in modern medicine, and Homoeopathic Medical College and a Homoeopathic Pharmaceutical Unit are some of the major units of F.M.C.I. A centre for de-addiction and rehabilitation of alcoholics is established with in-patient facilities.

Fr Augustus Muller, S.J. K.I.H., the pioneer of homeopathy in southern part of India, a great homoeopathic practitioner of his times and the first Indian repertorian was born in Westphalia, in Germany, on 13th of March 1841. Homoeopathic system of medicine, which originated in Germany, had a great influence on him

since his childhood. It cannot be merely a strange coincidence that the founder of homoeopathy, master Samuel Hahnemann in his school days was student of Augustine Muller the grandfather of Augustus Muller. Probably it was God's providence. There was a great similarity in the way of life between the two families. Fr Muller was born in a simple and religious family, which taught him simplicity and dedication. Since his childhood he received health care through the homoeopathic system of medicine. Probably this left a deep impression regarding the efficacy of the system. Fr Augustus Muller fell in love with Homoeopathy and popularized it not only in this district but also all over the country.

Despite the popularity Homoeopathy enjoys in our country, as is evident by the continued increase in the number of Registered Homoeopathic Practitioners as well as recognized Homoeopathic Medical College in the country, we find that a large number of practitioners are not able to practice the Science of Homoeopathy as per Hahnemann's teachings. Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical College, established in 1985, has taken up measures through a scientifically planned and well equipped institution so that properly trained, professionally competent, committed and dedicated Homoeopathic Physicians are put in the field. The example of Father Augustus Muller S.J. a true Homoeopath and other dedicated workers who followed him in his great tradition of selfless service to suffering humanity, helps to instill in the learner similar spirit essential to the CARE of the patient as well as of the Science and art of Homoeopathy.

I. OBJECTIVES

THE AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF FATHER MULLER HOMOEOPATHIC MEDICAL COLLEGE ARE:

- **To train** young men and women in Homoeopathic medicine and develop in them such skills as are needed to render effective health care to the suffering humanity.

- **To involve** the staff and the students in various Homoeopathic Research projects.
- **To promote** the science and system of Homoeopathy and to put it to service of common man.
- **To instill** in students a spirit of dedication and commitment after the example of the founder, Father Augustus Muller S.J.

II. DURATION OF COURSE

- 1) The B.H.M.S. degree course of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences (R.G.U.H.S.) comprises a formal education of 4½ years and compulsory internship training of 1 year, as prescribed in the Homoeopathy Degree Course (B.H.M.S.) Regulations 1983 of the Central Council of Homoeopathy, New Delhi.

III. FACILITIES AVAILABLE

- 1) The Homoeopathic Medical College has 100 beds attached to Homoeopathic Hospitals at Deralakatte in addition to this Superspeciality Hospital facilities are available at Kankanady and St. Anthony's Poor Homes for admitting patients. A well equipped Clinical Laboratory, Blood Bank, Radiology, Ultra Sound and Imaging departments and C.T. Scan, Surgical operation theatre, Labour theatre, Neonatal, Dental, I.C.U., Physiotherapy, Yoga and Naturopathy, Reproduction and child health department have been set up for the use of patients attending Homoeopathic Out-patient and In-patient departments.
- 2) Individualised attention right through the stay at Father Muller is assured. The internship programme provides a responsible participation in patient care, knowledge care and learner care.

- 3) Educational as well as clinical research programmes are regularly undertaken at Father Muller to ensure continued medical education for the faculty.
- 4) Adequate facilities for physical education, sports, games athletics and other co-curricular activities are made available.
- 5) **Library:** Extensive library service together with systematic use of audiovisual aids, e-Library are available to help the students in their learning process. The students are allowed to make use of the departmental and central library. They shall follow all the rules of the library. Helinet Facility of RGUHS is also provided in the library.
- 6) **Extra-Curricular Activities:** In view of the main aim of education as the total development of the Person, a number of opportunities are provided for the students to develop their skills and talents on various levels such as music, dance, indoor and outdoor games and sports. Well equipped with 400 mts track Stadium & Basket-Ball / Volleyball / Throwball / Shuttle / Badminton Courts have been included.
- 7) **Health Services:** Medical care will be given to students in case of illness at Father Muller's as per the Student Health Scheme.
- 8) **Botanical Garden:** A well maintained Botanical/Herbal Garden with Medicinal plants of academic importance is available to the students.
- 9) **Rural Health Clinics:** Villages and remote rural areas do not have adequate medical facilities as found in Urban developed areas. Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical

College has adopted 16 villages where mobile/clinics are conducted on regular basis. Medical camps and school health check up programmes are also held on regular basis.

RURAL HEALTH CLINIC

MEDICAL OUTREACH CENTRES:

From the time of inception of the college, there is a keen effort from the management and the faculty to maintain some regular mobile medical centres in suburban and rural areas. There were around 5 centres in 1985 and 10 centres in 1995 and by the year 2000 the number went up to 15 centres. Today we have around 16 peripheral mobile centres spread across the 2 districts - Dakshina Kannada and Kasaragod. Free medical check up and follow up treatment caters to the need of the rural people.

COMMUNITY HEALTH ACTIVITIES:

1. The College regularly conducts medical camps/health awareness programmes in different places of Dakshina Kannada and Kasaragod districts.
2. The college has a MoU with Canara Organization for development and peace-CODP (R) Mangalore & other social organizations in organizing such camps.
3. Every year special camps are organized on ALLERGIC DISEASES, DIABETES, HIV AWARENESS, WOMEN HEALTH, CHILDREN'S HEALTH CAMP, Health Tips to ADOLESCENT GIRLS of High School with active community participation.
4. Various international health days are observed either symbolically or by organizing some special lecture from a resource persons. Some important days observed in our college are World health day, World antileprosy day, World antitobacco day, World Diabetic Day, World children's day, International womens' day etc.

These events have now become as annual feature where general public as well as self help group of women and students are closely involved.

RESEARCH PROGRAMME:

1. From the very inception of the college, there is a keen interest in the research area.
2. Bhabha Atomic Research Centre - Mumbai has a research collaboration with the college.
3. At present the college is engaged in research on Cardiological conditions, Diabetes and Osteoarthritis in collaboration with the medical team of Fr. Mullers.

STUDENT'S NEWS:

1. Our students take part actively in various literary, cultural & sports intercollegiate competitions and bringing several medals/awards to the college.
2. Students are actively involved in NSS activities, community health surveys, research work.

- 10) The college also conducts M.D. (Hom) courses in 7 specialities i.e. Homoeopathic Materia Medica, Homoeopathic Philosophy & Organon, Repertory, Practice of Medicine, Paediatrics, Psychiatry and Pharmacy.

IV. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

Medium of Instruction and Examination shall be English.

V. APPLICATION AND ADMISSION

- 1) Admission of Students will be on the basis of merit. Since Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical College is an unaided Christian Minority Institution admission is primarily open to candidates from minority community, provided they meet the requirements. Candidates seeking admission must submit an application to the Admission Officer in the prescribed form which can be obtained from the office during working hours on cash payment or sending a D. D. for Rs. 400/- in favour of Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical College. The application forms can also be downloaded from our website www.fathermuller.com.
- 2) The completed application form along with the photocopies of certificates must be submitted either in person or by registered post so as to reach this office **NOT LATER THAN 30.05.2013**.
- 3) The completed application form is to be sent to: The Admission Officer, Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical College, University Road, Deralakatte, Mangalore – 575 018.
- 4) Admission to all courses will be provisional and is subject to the norms/provisions made applicable by the Government of Karnataka.
- 5) The candidates who meet the above requirements are required to appear for the Entrance Examinations and counselling conducted at Father Muller Homoeopathic Medical College, Deralakatte, Mangalore on **04.06.2013**.
- 6) The candidates shall bear all the expenses in connection with the counselling.
- 7) Candidates provisionally selected after the counselling will be intimated about the fees payable to the institution.

- 8) Selection intimation letter is to be surrendered to the college office at the time of paying the fees.
- 9) Admission secured on the basis of false information shall stand cancelled and the fees forfeited.
- 10) All communications from the college will be addressed to mailing address given in the application form.
- 11) The classes will commence as per the calendar of RGUHS. The same will be communicated to the candidates on receipt of the same from RGUHS. Candidates remaining absent for three consecutive days without prior permission shall forfeit their admission as well as fees.

VI. ELIGIBILITY FOR AN APPLICANT

1. A Candidate seeking admission should attain 17 years of age on 31st December 2013 and obtained minimum 40% of marks in Physics, Chemistry & Biology together at the P.U.C. examination of the Karnataka Board or other equivalent examinations, such as XII Std. (In the 10+2 system).
2. A candidate awaiting II P.U.C. results is also eligible to apply. But he/she does not qualify for admission unless he/she obtains more than 40% aggregate in II year P.U.C. in Physics, Chemistry and Biology. In case of students belonging to SC/ST and Category – I, the minimum requirement in percentage of marks shall not be less than 35% for admission to I BHMS course.
3. Special preference will be given for candidates with exemplary performance in co-curricular activities, sports, N.S.S. and N.C.C. or any recognized national events. They need to furnish the relevant documents, certificates for the same.

VII. CERTIFICATES AND DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

- 1) Conduct Certificate from the Head of the Institution, last attended.*
- 2) Transfer Certificate from Institution last studied. (T.C.)*
- 3) Marks Card – X Std, XII Std/II P.U.C.*
- 4) Migration Certificate.*
- 5) Three (3) passport size photographs.
- 6) Three (3) stamp size photographs.
- 7) Candidates who have passed an examination other than II P.U.C. of Karnataka State are required to produce an eligibility certificate from R.G.U.H.S. at the time of admission.

**All Copies of Certificates and Testimonials are to be attested by a Gazetted Officer/Headmaster or Principal. Originals need only to be produced at the time of the counselling.*

VIII. ADMISSION GRANTED IS PROVISIONAL AND SUBJECT TO

1. Production of Original P.U.C. Certificates, Certificates of age, Transfer Certificate, Migration Certificate (wherever applicable) and Certificate of eligibility from R.G.U.H.S.
2. The payment of all the fees.
3. Passing of the prescribed Medical Examination.
4. Approval by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka.

IX. FEES

1. The fees will be charged based on the expenses incurred on education and other facilities offered. Students are expected to meet the expenses.

2. Fees are liable to be revised every year and such revision will be made applicable to all.
3. Fees towards eligibility and Registration (Admission Approval) payable to Rajiv Gandhi University will be extra.
4. Failure to pay the term fees before the stipulated date shall invite penalty and withholding examination forms.
5. The Caution deposit will be refunded to the students without interest on request when he/she finally leaves the Institution after studies. Students are advised to preserve their Deposit Receipts carefully for cancellation against the refund of the deposit money.

HOSTEL

- 1) All the students are required to stay in the Hostel during their course of study. Every student should make an application in duplicate at the beginning of the academic year in the prescribed application form available on payment of Rs. 50/-.
- 2) As a policy every student/intern is expected to stay in Hostels. The student/intern may be allowed to stay outside provided he/she stays with their parents/elder brother/sister only.
- 3) Students once admitted to the hostels are not permitted to stay outside. Those who discontinue their stay due to any reason are required to pay the hostel fees for remainder of the entire course.
- 4) Hostel Accommodation is not available for students who are already married/Nikhah before joining the study course. Students who are already in the hostel wanting to get married/nikhah during the course of the study are required to follow rule no. 3 and make their own accommodation.

- 5) Hostel mess expenses for the boarder will be calculated on “Dividing System”. All expenses connected with hostel mess, repair and maintenance of kitchen equipment, gas, fuel etc., will be taken into consideration for calculation of the Hostel mess expenses.
- 6) Hostelites are required to inform the college management and wardens regarding the use of Electrical/Electronic appliances like laptop, iron box, heaters etc. and get permission.
- 7) Every hostelite is required to follow disciplinary Guidelines of the hostel. Parents/guardians are required to be in touch with Principal/Warden for discipline.

X. BREAKAGE AND LOSSES

These shall be made good promptly on demand. Failure to meet the demand during the stipulated time shall invite a penalty.

XI. VACATION

Leaves during the academic year can be availed through proper channel as per the leave format formulated by the management.

XII. EXAMINATION

- 1) Students should attend all the Classes. As per rules of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka a minimum of 80% of Attendance in all the subjects is required to be eligible to take University examination. Internal Assessment Rules have to be followed as per the Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences ordinance. Students who fail to score the required Internal Assessment marks will not qualify for University examination. As per RGUHS guidelines student should have minimum of 80% attendance and 35% minimum internal assessment marks to qualify for University examination.

- 2) **Academic Progress and Clinical Evaluation:** All students are expected to maintain a high academic and practical performance throughout the programme. To this effect regular written/practical/clinical tests will be conducted and progress reports will be maintained. Consistent standards of excellence are expected at all times. Students who do not show any progress or who fail repeatedly will not be allowed to appear for examinations/continue the course.
- 3) Students/Parents are required to go through the ordinance of Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for each academic year.
- 4) Examination fee as determined by the University is to be paid by the students.

XIII. GRADUATION

Following the successful completion of the BHMS Programme, the graduates will have convocation function in the Institution.

XIV. DISCIPLINE

- 1) Students are expected to behave with dignity and decorum and in conformity with the discipline of the Institution.
- 2) Students are required to dress decently and present themselves neat and tidy, avoiding exaggerated fashions.
 - **Dress code:**
 - Gents* - Formal Pants and Shirts.
 - Ladies* - Salwar Kameez with dupatta/Sari.
Sleeveless tops are not permitted.
 - They are required to wear apron and display their identity card inside the college campus.

- 3) A sense of decorum and discipline is expected of every student in the college, hospital as well as in the entire campus. **Ragging is strictly prohibited.** They shall not indulge either individually or collectively in any form of activity that will bring down the good name of the Institution/medical profession.
- 4) Students will refrain from disfiguring walls and furniture and from other objectionable practices.
- 5) Students will refrain from any form of indiscipline and misbehaviour unbecoming of members of the medical profession.
- 6) They will strive at all costs to preserve the Ethos of the Institution and promote its image and status by their behaviour and conduct.
- 7) Any breach of discipline shall be suitably dealt with. Serious lapses of discipline and character shall render the student's name liable to be struck off the roll of the college. If, in the opinion of the Principal, a student is not likely to benefit by his continuing in the college or if his continuance is considered to be detrimental to the best interest of the Institutions, the Management may order such a student to leave the College. No fees paid by the students will be refunded. The Management's decision in this regard shall be final.

XIV. GENERAL

WITHDRAWAL

- 1) **Withdrawal after completing the process of admission and before the commencement of the course:**

If a student who has been admitted to the course decides to withdraw before the commencement of the course, he/she will forfeit fees paid by him/her as follows:

Within 15 days after the provisional admission : 50%

Within 30 days after the provisional admission : 75%

No refund of fees will be made for the candidates after the commencement of the course. Rules governing for the withdrawal from the college during the course will be made applicable to the candidates.

2) Withdrawal from the College during the course:

Students are discouraged from discontinuing the course any time after the commencement of the same. However, if any student decides to withdraw voluntarily from the college at any time before completing the course, he/she shall communicate his/her decision to the Management in writing along with a letter from his/her parents in support of his/her decision. A student who fulfills these formalities and who is permitted to withdraw from the course is required to pay the course fee for the remainder of the course and Rs. 25,000/- as penal fees to the college. The fees already paid by the student will not be refunded to him/her under any circumstances.

- 3) In case of death of a student during the course of his/her studies, fees already paid will not be refunded to his/her parent/guardians. No fee for the remainder of the course shall be collected from the Parent/Guardian of such a student.
- 4) The college reserves the right to dismiss any student whose progress in studies or conduct is not found satisfactory / grave, during the period of training or service.
- 5) Every student is required to familiarize himself with the rules laid down in the Prospectus and also formulated and announced by the Management from time to time.

- 6) Students should not absent themselves from classes, practicals and examinations without the prior permission of the Principal. Such absence without leave may lead to loss of a term.
- 7) Students are not permitted to attend classes other than their own without the special permission of lecturer concerned.
- 8) Smoking and use of alcohol and drugs are strictly prohibited in all parts of the college, hospital campus and hostel.
- 9) Use of Mobile/Cell Phones is strictly prohibited during College/duty hours. If found using demands penalty and confiscation of the instrument.
- 10) No Society, Union or Association of the student shall be formed in the College and no outsider, invited to address a meeting without the Principal's specific permission.
- 11) In the College debates and other meetings, the Chair must be taken by a responsible person approved previously by the Principal and the subject of the debate must have been approved by the Principal.
- 12) Students of the College are advised not to get married/ Nikhah during the course of study in the College. However, if any one gets married/Nikaha, under any circumstance, they will have to make their own arrangements for accommodation, as married persons are not admitted to the College Hostel.
- 13) In all matters, whether covered or not in the existing rules, the decision of the Management shall be final.

- 14) The Management reserves the rights of making any addition to or deletion from or alteration in the above rules and regulation including fee structure without prior notice. Interpretation given by the Management regarding the details of this prospectus will be final.
- 15) For all legal matters/disputes arising out of provisions of this prospectus the court of Jurisdiction will be that of Mangalore only.

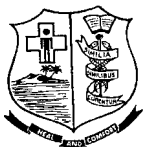

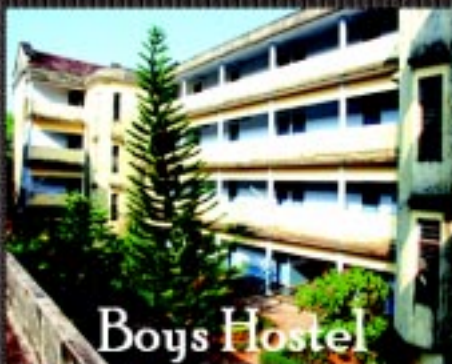

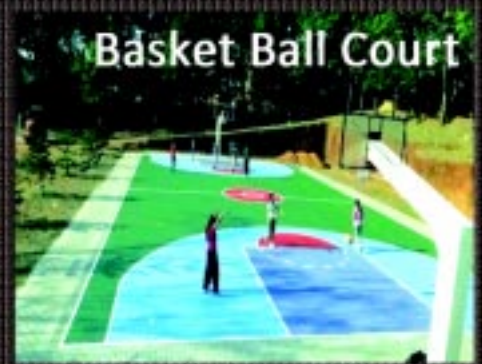
